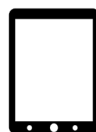
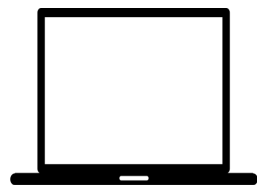
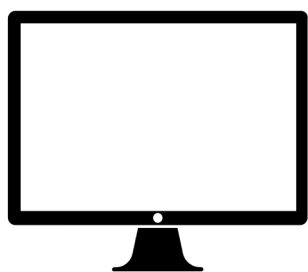

Process is emphasized over product in age-appropriate sessions. At their own pace and level, all students learn about basic art concepts such as line, color, shape, and texture. Art activities include multi-sensory experiences, story time, and play designed to advance your child's development and foster an early appreciation for the arts.
