



## I SITAR SERVES THOSE IN NEED

INCOME HOUSEHOLDS






## 2. SITAR'S STUDENTS GAIN ESSENTIAL SKILLS










## SITAR STUDENT PROFICIENCY IN THE FOUR TARGETED 21ST CENTURY LEARNING SKILLS




